



Message from Designated Pastor Mindy...



Sometimes when I'm pondering how slowly your call process is going, I think (and sometimes say), "You would think hat some pastor would come here just so they could look at this view while they write their sermons." And that tends me to make me think about ways in which we might use this gift to the glory of God. More frequent outdoor worship is an obvious starting point, but I suspect that there is much more that might arise with prayerful consideration. Consider that an invitation.

And while your at it, consider other gifts that you, as individuals or as a congregation, could celebrate more and use more for the sake of God's world. I believe that all of us have a whole collection of differing gifts, many of which we leave unwrapped on the shelf. Why? Sometimes because the gifts we have shared haven't been valued by those around us, sometimes because they're so big they're a little scary, sometimes because they're not a gift we particularly wanted.

Here's a proposal: let's help one another discover, acknowledge, and use our gifts. Let us be brave and honest in exploring our gifts (sometimes their purpose takes a while to become clear). And let us thank the Giver with humility and enthusiasm.

Could you become a Licensed Lay Minister?

Have you ever asked yourself "What is God calling me to do right now in my life? How can I best serve God and my neighbor? What gifts do I have that I am not using?" If so, becoming a Licensed Lay Minister (LLM) could be the answer to these profound discerning questions. The church has always needed and benefited from lay leaders and the variety of gifts they bring to the church community.

God calls each and every one of us to use our particular set of skills and talents to serve our church community through loving service and by sharing the Good News we have in the resurrection of Jesus Christ.

Licensed Lay Ministers will be licensed by our Synod Bishop to perform certain duties within specific congregations or 6261 ministry communities. Duties may include: leading worship and preaching, leading Bible studies, visiting hospitals, the homebound, and others who request a visit. Also, potential for receiving authorization to perform Sacraments (holy communion, baptisms, funerals, and marriage ceremonies) in special circumstances.

Each day members of Christ's United bow their heads and lift their hearts in prayer for the ministries of this congregation and people in need.








School Kits needed for Lutheran World Relief

Items may be brought in August 4 thru 25.

Education is important in every community but especially those where poverty or disaster limits the options of young people looking to improve their lives. School Kits contain essential supplies to help children continue learning despite the hardships they face. These supplies mean the difference between getting an education or not.

The supplies for each School Kit are:

- Four 70 sheet spiral notebooks
- One 30 centimeter ruler (or with inches and centimeters)
- One pencil sharpener
- One blunt scissors (safety scissors with steel blades)
- One box of 16-24 crayons
- One 2 1/2 inch eraser
- Five black or blue ballpoint pens
- Five unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers
- One sturdy drawstring back style cloth bag (14" x 17")

In the coming weeks the school supplies will begin to be in stores (much to the dismay of many children and adults) at great low prices so keep these items in mind.

Donations of any of these items should be placed on the table in the Narthex August 4 - 25.


