



RIVER — In the Bible, rivers (and other bodies of water) often represent deliverance, salvation, freedom and cleansing. The image of crossing the Jordan River has long been a metaphor for death — crossing from earthly to heavenly life, from worldly struggles to the bliss of God's kingdom, from physical ailments to the wholeness of a resurrection body.

Message from Pastor Brian

Grace and Peace to you from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ. Amen!



I end up having a lot of interesting conversations (such as the one I talked about in May where the woman was aghast at me for not wearing a coat on a Saturday morning). One of the "perks" of my vocation is that I am invited into peoples' lives simply on the basis of being a pastor, and I really, really get to know the people. At least I hope I do.

I've been thinking a lot about who we are and how we communicate that to people. Sometimes we have things we don't want people to know about us

And you know what? I think a lot of those things are universal.

I don't care who you are - you have something in your past that you do not want anyone to know. You have things in your family history that you are uncomfortable talking about. You likely have a personal struggle you would like to hide away.

However, my brothers and sisters -we are all in this together. Sometimes this may be a reluctant together, but we are all indeed in this life together, both the times when we feel like we have it together and the times when we are struggling. And I have a feeling, for most of us, we have it together far less than we would like to admit.

So this summer, come and join in the conversations. And let us work together to cultivate an environment where nobody is afraid to share their true self.

You've probably noticed that I share in my sermons stories that don't necessarily paint me in the best light. This is absolutely intentional. Not only does it go along with what I was taught in seminary, but I believe those stories make me relatable (and, for good or bad, they are largely true with the possibility of an identity being changed here or there).



Sometime soon, we are all going to have something come up that will cause stress that we didn't plan (and, really, there's no such thing as planned stress).

Sometime soon, we are all going to hear news that we don't want to hear, be it about our area, a friend, or even ourselves.

Sometime soon, we are all going to do something that we will regret, out of anger or jealousy or some other emotion that we don't want to feel.

BUT

Sometime soon, you will be a source of support for someone that God has put in your path.

Sometime soon, you will experience unexpected joy that God has placed in your life.

Sometime soon, the Phillies will win the World Series err, strike that. That's the earthly, not the heavenly. Sometime soon, you will have the opportunity to make your blessings spread out to be another's blessing.
