

GREEN — Green is the traditional liturgical color for the weeks after Pentecost (as well as the season of Epiphany). The Pentecost season largely overlaps with spring and summer, which is fitting because green symbolizes growth: growth of plant life and crops, and growth of the church in discipleship and faith.

Message from Designated Pastor Mindy...

Pentecost!

Red geraniums are a nice start. Red, for fire, is the liturgical color, of course! And it can be used liberally in clothing and scarves draped here and there and....then there was the year I put a temporary red streak in my hair and brought the can to church in case there were other takers (there were).

Fire isn't just red, of course. There's orange and yellow and iridescent blue and gold for continuity with Easter.

But of course Pentecost isn't just about fire. Acts says the event started with a sound like that of a violently blowing wind. Bright wind socks, anyone? Pinwheels?

And what is the "wind" that often moves pinwheels? Breath, right?

So, the Hebrew word ruach just so happens to mean both breath and spirit. The Spirit of God breathes life. And when we sing, "Breathe on Me, Breath of God," we are signaling openness, but as the King James puts it "the Spirit bloweth where it listeth." Sometimes God's breath is the gentlest of cooling breezes on a fevered brow, promising continued life. Sometimes it is a cyclone that picks us up and drops us in a strange place, unsure of anything except that we're not in Kansas anymore. God is not tame, but is goodness and life. Surrender, live, and celebrate!

And so, we must be prepared. It is not enough to know about Jesus, but we need to truly know Him. To do this we must read the Bible because it tells us who He is, and we must pray to Him – to really talk to Him. How else do you get to know someone except by talking to Him. Paul tells us in Romans 10:9-10 how to be saved. He writes "That if you confess with your mouth. "Jesus is Lord," and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved. For it is with your heart that you believe and are justified, and it is with your mouth that you confess and are saved."

And so even during these troubling times we see examples of God's love for us. We see evidence that He is still in control. But we also need to be prepared for when He sends his Son, Jesus Christ, again to claim His beloved children. In order to rise with Him in glory we need to believe in our hearts and proclaim with our mouths that He is Lord of All. It is not enough to just know about Him but we need to truly know Him.


