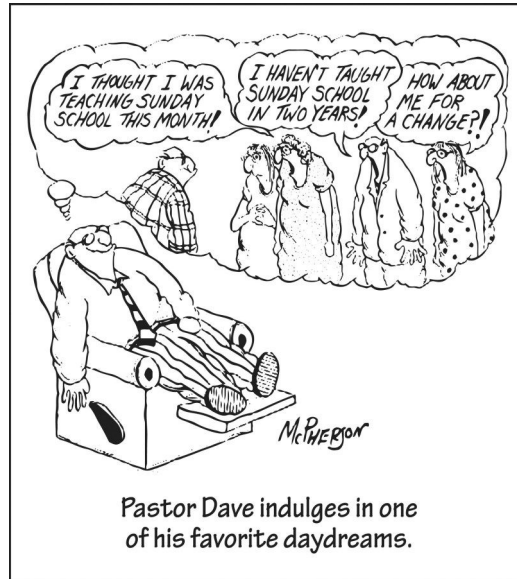

## Member's Message from Erik Tice...

Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Do you pray?

I guess we all do pray. But do we know how, or when, or where, or why to pray?

Some people will pray at length! Unfortunately, sometimes I ramble on and on while praying. Then I think, God's up there telling me "Just get on with it and Get to the point!" Jesus said in Mark, chapter 12 to watch out for the teachers of the law, they devour widows' houses and for a show make lengthy prayers. He also said, "And when you pray, do not keep on babbling like pagans, for they think they will be heard because of their many words. Do not be like them, for your Father knows what you need BEFORE you ask him" (Matthew 6:7-8). We don't have to have a lengthy prayer to talk to God. On the other hand, is saying "Lord, help me" too short of a prayer? No. David in Psalm 6, verse 9 says "The Lord has heard my cry for mercy; the Lord accepts my prayer." Be assured that no matter the length of your prayer, God hears you.

Many of us pray when we are in church, but you don't just have to pray in church! You can pray anywhere. I often pray while driving in the car, mowing grass, cleaning the house. It's time alone between you and God. Jonah chapter 2 begins, "From inside the fish Jonah prayed to the Lord his God." For the next nine verses Jonah prayed. Verse 10, "and the Lord commanded the fish, and it vomited Jonah onto dry land!" I don't think any of us will ever be praying inside of a large fish, but if you ever are in a situation to do so, PRAY! God answers, no matter when you pray!

Jesus said, "And when you pray, do not be like the hypocrites, for they love to pray standing in the synagogues and on the street corners to be seen by men. I tell you the truth, they have received their reward in full. But when you pray, go into your room, close the door and pray to your Father, who is unseen" (Matthew 6:5-6). Some people pray in the morning after getting up. They find a quiet spot to sit and drink a cup of coffee or tea and pray. Some people pray at night before they go to bed.

- Several new rope cinctures will be purchased for the Acolytes, Crucifers and Worship Leaders.

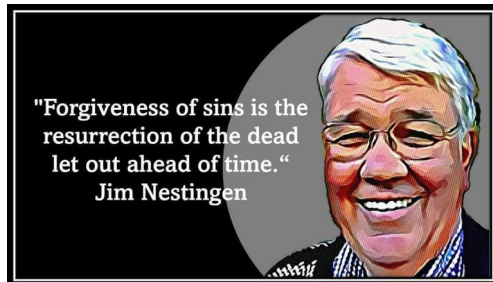

### Listen to the loving voice

Figurative thieves are all around: Illness steals time and energy. Inflation robs many of financial stability. The bandit of social media chips away at our productivity, self-esteem, quality time with loved ones. Prejudice and oppression prey on certain groups of people. Doubtless, you can think of other thieves and bandits.

But above their noise, listen for another sound: A warm voice whose loving tone calls us by name. 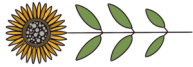

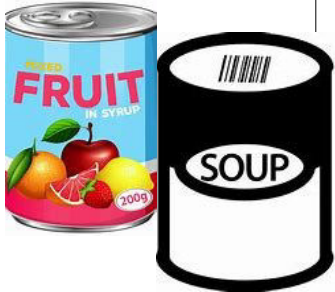
