





Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

The first day of April this year brings The Triduum, the great Three Days from Maundy Thursday to Easter Sunday. In it we walk with our Lord Christ from his Last Supper with his disciples to his joyous Resurrection from the dead; and we are changed. What life-giving changes does our Lord bring to you this April? Certainly, the increased number who have received their COVID-19 vaccine is one positive change, as are the stimulus checks that are arriving. So, too, that more students this fall will be back in the classroom. These are positive external changes that God brings to us. But there are internal changes as well. This brings to mind the hymn "Change My Heart, O God" (ELW #810)


Change my heart, O God; make it ever true. Change my heart, O God; may I be like you. You are the potter; I am the clay. Mold me and make me; this is what I pray.

What heart changes is our Lord bringing to you this month? With whom in your family or church family do you need reconciliation? It's easy to dismiss such an inquiry, thinking there is no one with whom we need to work out differences. Or else we know full well where the conflict lies, but see no hope of resolution. Recently I read an editorial by Mustafa Nuur in the *Patriot News* out of Harrisburg. The writer is a refugee from Somalia who owns a restaurant in Lancaster. He has heard angry voices shout "Terrorist!" at him, as well as "Go back to where you came from!" In truth, he and his family fled terror in Somalia. His mother and three brothers are employed



One day Mustafa received an email from a man telling him that refugees like him are a drain on society. Instead of ignoring it, Mustafa met the guy for coffee. It turns out they both had lost their fathers at a young age. Both were the oldest children in their families. They shared the same burdens, hopes and dreams. Turns out neither was the monster the other one thought he was.

I do not pretend that this is as easy as it sounds. Still, as Mustafa's father used to say: "If you know someone's story, it's very hard to hate them". And you and I are not left to our own devices in pursing reconciliation. We have the CULC family to help us. Most importantly, we have the God who gave his only begotten Son to die and rise again for our sake, and who changes our hearts in surprising and wonderful ways.


Church Council Highlights from March







The hidden surprise in these sweet rolls hints at the reason behind Easter's joy.

What you need:

- ½ cup chopped pecans
- 10 uncooked frozen rolls, thawed
- 10 large marshmallows
- ½ cup sugar
- 1 tsp cinnamon
- ½ cup melted butter
- ¼ cup brown sugar
- Adult help

What you do:

- 1. Grease a round baking dish. Sprinkle pecans on the bottom.
- 2. Flatten each roll. Place a marshmallow in the center. wrap dough around it and pinch edges together.
- 3. Combine sugar and cinnamon. Dip each roll into melted butter and coat with cinnamon-sugar. Place in pan, seam side down.
- 4. Sprinkle brown sugar and remaining butter over rolls. Cover with plastic wrap and let rise 30 minutes.
- 5. Bake at 350 degrees until golden brown, about 30 minutes. Cool in pan.
- 6. As you bite into a roll, you'll see the marshmallow has melted, leaving an empty center – just like Jesus' empty tomb!
