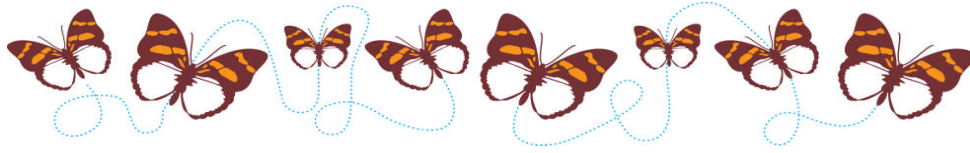

Pastor Kim's Message

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

I'm moving to Germanville. (The ugly gray house).

As everyone who has ever moved knows, the greatest emotional stress in moving is not the new house, new location, or new neighbors. It is the old baggage. The things that we have surrounded ourselves with and have to decide whether to carry along with us on the new journey.

As boxes are being collected and cabinets are being emptied, everything is being looked at with a different eye. I have begun the formidable task of "sorting": going through the things that I have become accustomed to being around me each day and asking myself whether or not I really need them. It is a process that brings up memories, good and bad, thoughts of cost, and space. You describe it in whatever terms you want, but what the whole packing process boils down to is one question:

"How important is this to me?"

Depending on the answer, the object is carefully packed, lovingly surrounded by cushioning paper, waiting to be placed with honor and love in the new home,

or,

tossed to the trash pile to be unceremoniously dumped in the garbage can to be hauled away, out of our lives forever, maybe – just maybe – to be thought of at some time in the future, the thought accompanied by a shrug and "oh well, its gone now".

As overwhelming as this may sound, the truth is that we sort every day. Each activity, each purchase, each moment of our time, each belief... is sorted by the question, "How important is this to me?" An old joke about this was "if you really want to know what is important to someone, check

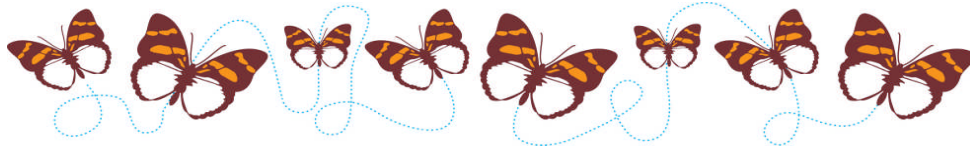

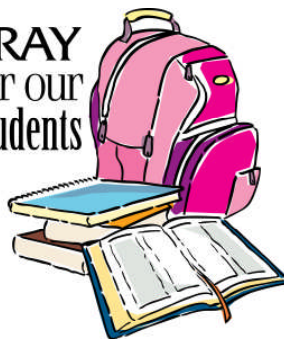

Ministry of the Month

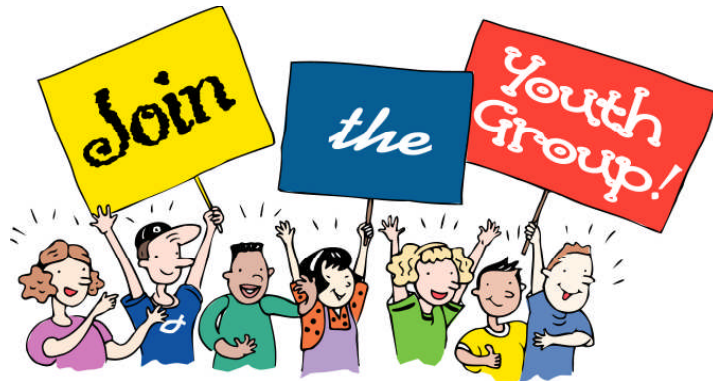

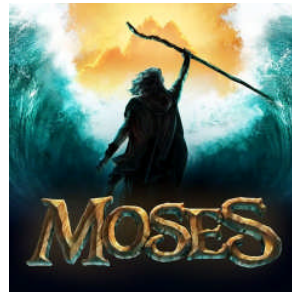
Calling all the Ladies of Christ's United: Your Nite has Arrived!!!

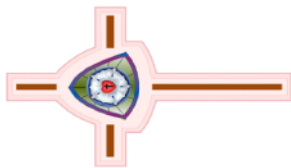

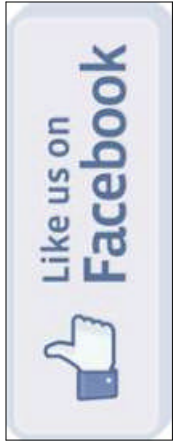
