

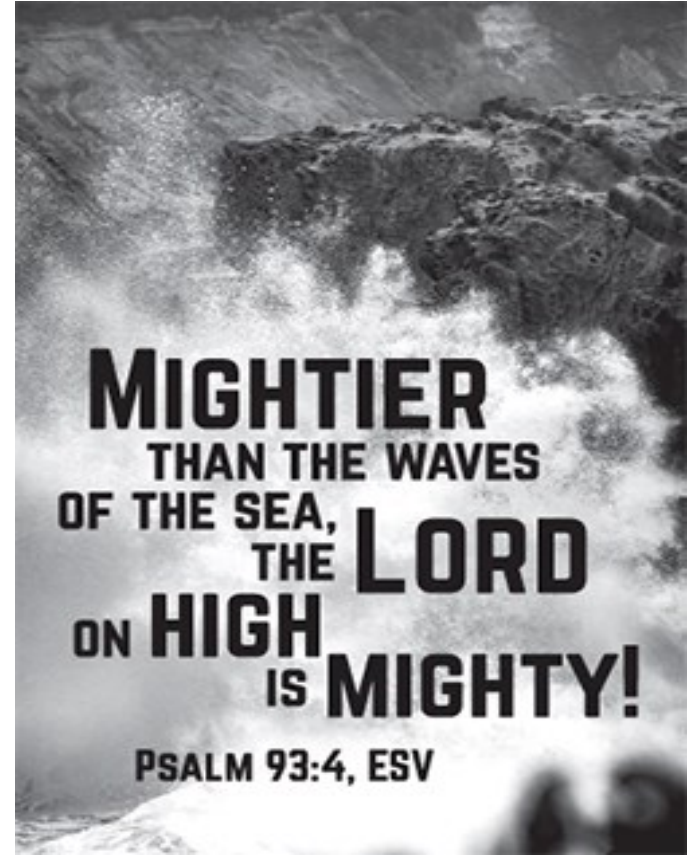

The Pastor's Part:

Stewardship

Every faculty you have, your power of thinking or of moving your limbs from moment to moment, is given you by God. If you devoted every moment of your whole life exclusively to His service, you could not give Him anything that was not in a sense His own already.

- C. S. Lewis, Mere Christianity

Just say the word "stewardship" and you'll see eyebrows raising. The word stirs up feelings of fear, annoyance, and even panic for some people. These reactions are understandable considering how the word "stewardship" has been often used as a weapon, a threatening tool of churches to pay for projects and pastors. But even though that is how the word has been used, it is not what it means.

The word "stewardship" is not about money: it is about relationship.

The word began in the beginning, when the Spirit of God flowed over the chaos and formed the universe, creating the heavens and the dry land, the mountains and the seas, the fish and the furry, the slimy and the sleek. And the word took form as God gathered the dust and shared His breath and humanity was formed.

Then God said, "Let us make humanity in our image to resemble us so that they may take charge of the fish of the sea, the birds in the sky, the livestock, all the earth, and all the crawling things on earth."

God created humanity in God's own image, in the divine image God created them, male and female God created them. Genesis 1: 26-27

Unlike anything else created, it is humanity that carries God's breath, God's life, and... God's love.

This doesn't sound like a very *sweet* offer!

By the word God created the richness of the earth, reflecting God's beauty and harmony, a place of joy where God walked freely with humanity to enjoy the peace, the work of God's heart – and human hands. As humanity was set apart by God's breath, so was humanity set apart by God's purpose. For as God gave His word to create the universe, God has created humanity to care for it. In Genesis 2: 15 we see our purpose as God placed humanity as "stewards" in God's Garden, to take care of it, to nurture it, to grow it, so that its beauty and peace may continue to be enjoyed by God – with us – together. The beginning of stewardship.

As the people of God, as the church on earth, the word stewardship is to do more than raise our eyebrows: it is to raise our hearts. It is a word that defines our relationship, gives us confidence, purpose and hope. In stewardship our lives have a meaning that is directly connected with eternity and born in boundless love.


So it seems fitting that this month of February, when we remember the loves in our lives with words on pictures of hearts, we start a new series of articles in our newsletter about living in the love of God. Watch for new insights into our lives of faith in the stewardship section of the newsletter each month. Check the website for new videos as members of our church family – near and far – share their personal stories of stewardship.

And in it all, may your relationship with God ever grow in in His love.

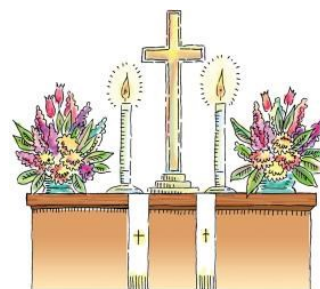

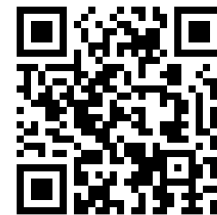

Remember....

That you are dust, and to dust you shall return. Such are the words of blessing offered on Ash Wednesday, as we remember our humanity and God's immortal love, shown to us in Jesus Christ. It is a time of somberness in recognition of the love so strong that death could not break its grasp on us, as Jesus carries us from death to life. Come and remember: Services will be held at Noon and 7:00 pm on Wednesday, March 1.



During Lent all are invited as in faith we gather each Wednesday night for a Soup Supper and Worship. The Social Ministry Team introduces the meal at 6:00 by sharing information on ministries around the world, telling us how our actions are affecting the lives of others (for good!). We then gather as light breaks the darkness in Holden Evening Prayer at 7 pm. This is a special time of faith, the gathering together deepening our understanding of God's actions of love in Jesus Christ. Please set aside time in your schedule to share in this special practice of Lent and bring a friend!

Collection of the Palms

Once we waved them with shouts of triumph in celebration of our Lord and King. Many then took their palms home - placing them on pictures, mantles, or the sun visor of their cars - any where that would remind them of that day. The palms were a sign of celebration: but now they are a sign of our mortality. Please bring your palms to Christ's United and place them in the bin in the gathering area. The palms will be burned, and the ashes used to anoint our heads on Ash Wednesday (March 1, 2017).
