Pastor Kim's Message

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

What did you get?

If you weren't able to spend any time at the Annual Egg Hunt here at Christ's United, I hope you were able to watch one somewhere. Because otherwise you missed some really cute exchanges as little kids were comparing their Easter egg baskets.

I got two purple and a green!
I got five pinkie ones and three blue ones!
Wanna trade?

The whole event was wonderful, and many thanks to all those who organized it and helped out at the event. What's curious about it was that the excitement was all based on what they found – eggs, prizes, parents - not too different from our life as adults. Whether it be talking about the things we get (“wait-till-you-see the new boat I found on sale”) or faith (“I found it” – really? I didn't know God was lost...) most of our celebrations are caused by the presence of things.

But Easter is exactly opposite.

The whole miracle of Easter is based on absence, not presence.

The first travelers to the tomb fully expected to find the dead body of Jesus there, the women actually having brought spices with them precisely because of that expectation. Peter and the loved disciples looked into the tomb because they thought the women were crazy when they said the body was not there.

Then, even after they found Jesus alive, he was gone again! (*Hence the Festival of Ascension, see the invitation later in this newsletter*).

The miracle of Easter is that Jesus is NOT there: not among the dead in the tomb, and not casually walking around waiting to die (again).

What didn't you get?
Death.

The miracle of Easter is that Jesus lived, died, lived, and lives forever in heaven – in Him, by Him, through Him, death is destroyed forever. And Jesus, the not “among the dead” living Saviour, invites us to join Him for a dinner celebration of the event, a celebration that never, ever, goes away.

So this Easter season and all the seasons that follow it, let our praise and celebration never go away.

Please join with me this weekend and every weekend to come together in a celebration of what the disciples did not find at Easter, lifting our voices in praise and amazement as we together exclaim:

CHRIST IS RISEN!!!!

HE IS RISEN INDEED!!!!

sryouth@christsunited.org. Teens please be at the church for 3:30 and moms please join us for service @ 5pm. Dinner will be as close to 6:00 as possible.

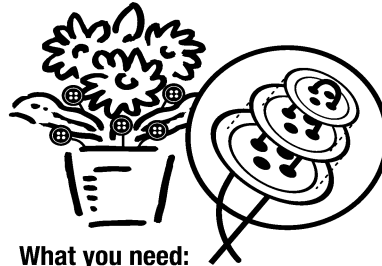

Blooming Button Flowers

For Mother's Day, add a special touch to any houseplant with this easy craft.



What you need:

- A small houseplant with leaves
- Colorful buttons of various sizes
- Green 26-gauge floral wire
- Wire cutters

What you do:

1. Stack three buttons from largest to smallest, with the smallest on top. Align the button holes.
2. Cut 8 inches of wire. Thread it up through one hole of the stacked buttons and back down through another hole.
3. Twist the wire just below the bottom side of the button stack to secure it.
4. Insert the "flower" in the plant's soil and repeat the process.
5. Present this to Mom and wish her a happy Mother's Day!

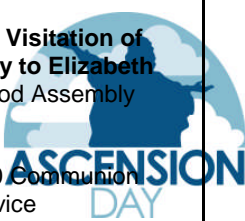

Mission District Council Dinners Encourage Sharing, Learning

Twice in 2013 the council members of the Schuylkill Mission District were treated to dinners prepared by SALM, mission district council member, and former chef Regnal Leibensperger, who was once the owner-operator of the Deer Lake Inn. The purpose of the dinners is not just to eat Regnal's stuffed peppers, but to have time for the council members to report what their congregations are doing, to learn from each other, and to discuss matters of mutual interest.



Here are just a few examples: At the dinner held November 10 at Christ's United, Ashland, the representatives of St. Paul, Tower City, spoke about their labyrinth. Christ's United set up display tables that described their many ministries, such as offering assistance to Schuylkill Women in Crises. St. John, Friedensburg, told about their box holder mailings that made their services known to

the entire area. St. Paul, Port Carbon, told about their monthly "joyful noise" offerings for various causes. Trinity, Pottsville, spoke about an after-school program to help with homework.



Even before coming to the dinners, the councils had questions to discuss: How would the general membership of your congregation accept the goal "to share God's love with as many people and in as many ways as possible"? How would your council accept that goal? What are specific ways in which your congregation tries to "share God's love"? As a congregation, would you rather be comfortable and do what you like, even if it means the death of your



congregation, or would you rather find ways to reach out to new people even if that requires setting aside cherished ways of doing things?

At these sessions the council members could hear what the other churches are actually doing, gaining ideas for themselves. They could also notice that every congregation, no matter how small, is indeed doing something significant to share God's love.

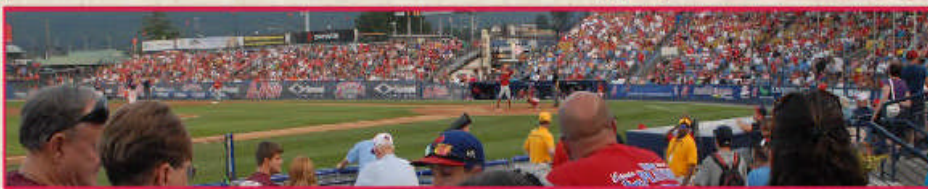

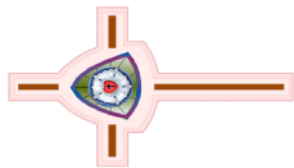
