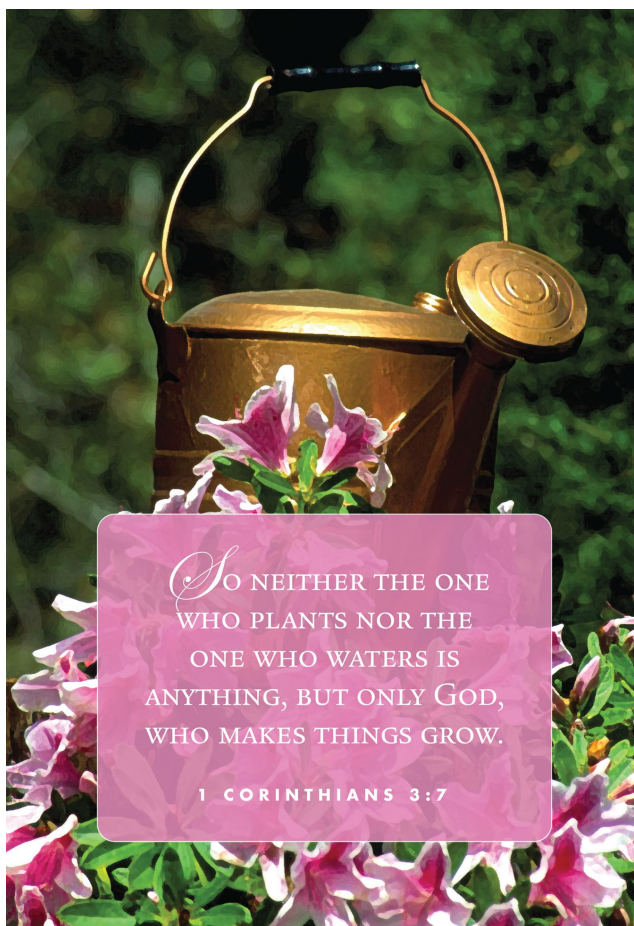

Pastor Kim's Message

Brothers and Sisters,

Whoosh.

It's been windy lately. I thought about how windy it's been while standing out in the yard this afternoon, feeling the wind against my face and watching the turbines spin on the mountain. Through opened windows, the wind blew out the germs and odors that have built up in the house over the last few months. Clothing blows back and forth on the line, a visible sign of wind's invisible force, making clothes smell fresh and new. The wind feels fresh and wonderful after an uncomfortable winter.

The wind changes things too. The lawn chairs have scattered from the neat little grouping I had planned. Plants and garbage cans are in places I never intended. And it's not just me: others are noticing it too. A painter said that the wind has changed how he can do his job, as it will blow the paint all over (not just where he wants it to go).

It's often windy at Christ's United. People have to hold the car doors to keep them from flying open. The flags move in a wild, seemingly uncontrollable dance while the thick poles are bent in submission. The roof creaks and groans, an audible witness to those gathered under the protective beams, giving us a hint that the wind's mighty force changes not only what's outside, but what's inside as well.

When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place. And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability.

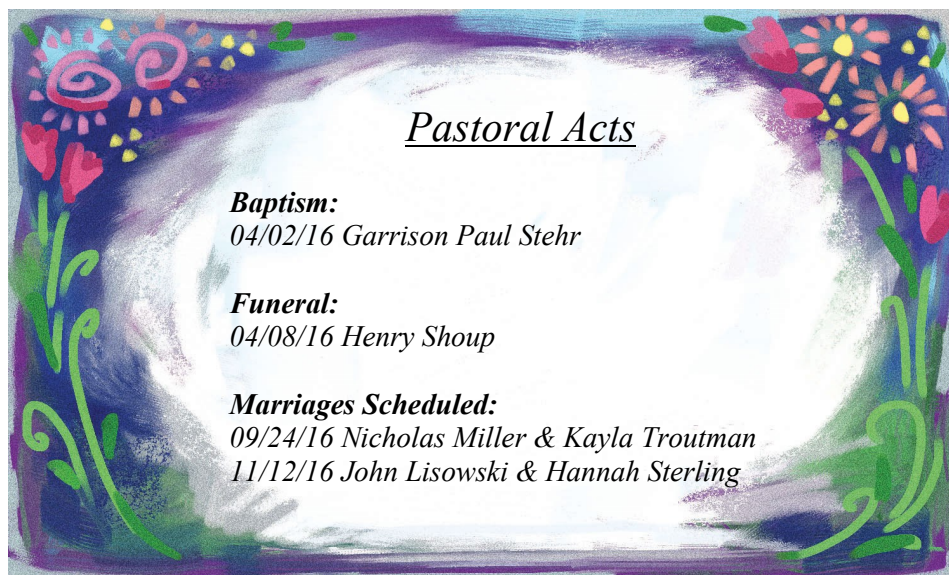


The wind is the sign of the Holy Spirit, giving people the ability to do what they – what you – don't expect them to do. Children running into church, anxious to get to class. Teenagers leading in worship each week. Adults working together to help people they never met. And it's not just us: others are noticing it too. Through opened hearts, the wind blows down the walls and changes the inside, and the outside as well.

Come, and let the wind of the Spirit blow through you. Let the wind blow out the hurt and pain that has built up over the years. Let the wind cause you to move in ways you never expected, your dance a visible sign of the mighty force. Open your heart this day of Pentecost, and let May 15th be the day that the wind changed you: inside, and out.

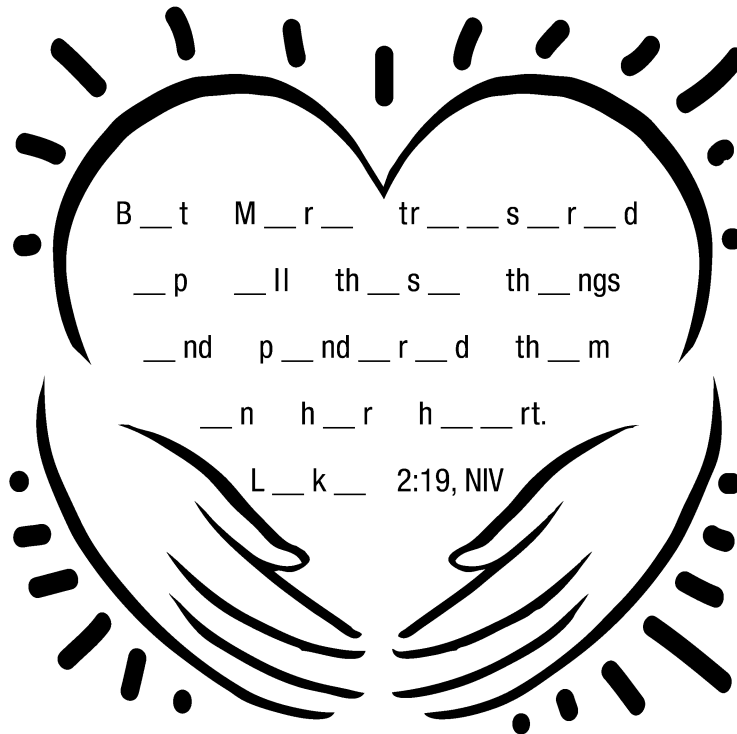

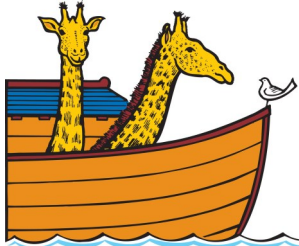


Each month we like to have a different picture from long ago. See if you can guess who some or all of the people in the picture are. The answers will be in next months "Life Together" Newsletter.

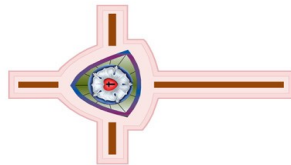
