

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Rhonda Carl—attends Kings College where she is majoring in the 5-year Masters Degree Physician Assistance Program.


David Hall—attends Penn State Schuylkill Campus where he is majoring in Mechanical Engineering.

Annual Meeting

No one likes to talk about numbers – but what about ministries? Christ's United is a congregation committed to ministry – the daily living of our faith by

serving others – and the numbers are astounding. A long time leader in sharing food with the hungry in our area, we are opening a second food pantry this month – Christ's Cupboard – to address the growing need. Children in the hospital due to serious illness will have their spirits lifted as they play with the Jared boxes we provide. Those who have suffered a loss of a loved one hold each other up during meetings of our Grief Group. All are lifted by the songs of our choir and in worship through the music offered. Ministry is happening here through Christ's United, and the need is growing.

Each day there are more instances of the need for God's presence in our community and world: but how are others to see God's presence if we, His hands and feet, do not proclaim and share?

Plan to participate in the Annual Meeting on Sunday, 9 November. We will begin with worship, to center our hearts on Jesus Christ. And then we will look at what God has done through us, and where God is calling us. Copies of the reports are available on the website and on the information tables. We may call it a budget, but it really is not about the numbers: it is about the ministry of God in this time and place, the ministry of God in us.




"Knaughty Knotters Knews"

Ministry of the Month

The Endowment Fund Committee is made of up of 5 voting members of the congregation who meet AT LEAST twice per year to manage monies donated to the fund. The money is deposited into one of the endowment fund accounts where it is audited yearly.

Endowment Funds can be used for:

- A) Scholarships to members of Christ's United Lutheran Church for educational purposes to those planning on attending college, seminary, nursing or medical school;
- B) For church related camping trips, leadership conferences, or other training that enables members of the congregation to grow in Christian faith and service to God's people;
- C) Outreach into the community which may include grants to ELCA colleges, seminaries, social service agencies, institutions and agencies to which this congregation relates;
- D) Any other purpose the Committee deems appropriate and follows the guidelines for which this Fund was established.

Each year student members of the congregation, who are furthering their education beyond high school, can request a scholarship from the Endowment Fund Committee. The amount of the scholarship is based on the interest earned on the accounts during the prior calendar year and the number of students requesting a scholarship. See page 8 of this newsletter for a listing of this year's recipients. All students are asked to
