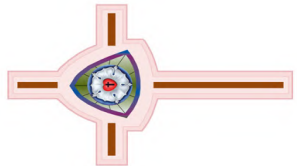

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Christ's United Church does a lot of things well - worshipping with energy; encouraging youth when they contribute their talents in school, the community and here at CULC; delving into the study of our faith with openness and excitement; reaching out with care to those who are sick or in grief. But nothing beats what CULC does in the kitchen -- Social hours each Sunday, Lutheran Church Men's dinners, and Women of the ELCA's candy making are just a few examples.

Which got me thinking about Jesus and food. Luke's Gospel is full of examples of what has been called ***Jesus' Table Fellowship***. In Chapter 5 we find Jesus eating with tax collectors and sinners at Levi's home. In Chapter 9 Jesus feeds 5,000 people. In Chapter 14 he tells the Parable of the Great Dinner, urging us to invite the poor rather than our friends to dinner (I can't remember the last time I did that!).

A group of people have come up with a creative way for folks with different backgrounds and opinions to come together in dialogue rather than in argument. They call it ***the People's Supper***. They write, "For millennia, sharing a meal has stood as one of the things that all of us - whoever we are and wherever we come from - have in common. We're out to prove that a group of thoughtful people - no matter their politics, race, religion and generation - can sit down over a shared meal, go beneath the headlines, and understand the real stories that have shaped who we are".

## Labors of love

Thomas Merton, an American monk, writer and social activist, said, "It is in the ordinary duties and labors of life that the Christian can and should develop his spiritual union with God." As the United States observes Labor Day, may we find meaning not simply in marking summer's end but in celebrating the ways nearly all "duties and labors of life" can empower ministry and faith.

Whether as a dentist, parent, artist, teacher, mechanic, gardener, city councilor, farmer, day laborer, attorney or anything else, a Christian can begin each workday or shift by praying for opportunities to serve whoever they'll encounter. We also can pray for and seek ways to grow in "spiritual union with God": cultivating spiritual fruits; actively loving God and neighbor; seeing Jesus in the vulnerable; practicing humility, gratitude and praise.

In Labor Day, may we find inspiration to make all our labors loving and faithful!



Despite the family arguments that sometimes erupt around the Thanksgiving table, eating together often breaks down barriers. After all, you can always shove another mouthful of food in, or excuse yourself to go to the bathroom, to keep from saying the hateful thing you wanted to. More than that, *eating together can give us a brave space to reveal the scars we have received and the wounds we have caused ... and be surprised that the one we thought most different from ourselves has similar scars and wounds.*

So, grab a seat with someone whose politics, religious affiliation, or lifestyle seems completely contrary to your own. And dare to share your scars and wounds with them. Don't be afraid. For our Lord Jesus is at the table with you.

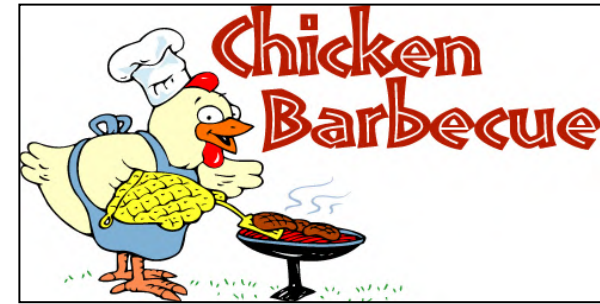

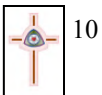
